

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.10 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.1000 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE RATE	\$0.0931 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL RATE	\$0.0964 per \$100
DE MINIMIS RATE	\$0.1005 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2023 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 from the same properties in both the 2022 tax year and the 2023 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 exceeds the voter-approval tax rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue rate. This means that Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2023 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON AUGUST 16, 2023 AT 7 P.M. AT 353 SOUTH COMMONS FORD ROAD, AUSTIN, TEXAS 78733.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the voter-approval tax rate but not greater than the de minimis rate and does not exceed the rate that allows voters to petition for an election under Section 26.075, Tax Code. If Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 adopts the proposed tax rate Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 is not required to hold an election so that the voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate and the qualified voters of the Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 may not petition the Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 to require an election to be held to determine whether to reduce the proposed tax rate.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average resident homestead by Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average resident homestead by Travis County Emergency Services District No. 10 this year.
